Luke brings what he calls an "orderly account" of the life, death, resurrection, and ministry of Jesus and its urgent importance. Luke then follows it up with his singular account that profiles the work of Peter, John, Paul, and other apostles. In his carefully crafted manuscripts, we find faith-supporting history and are given an eyewitness account of God at work for us. We thank God that by the working of the Holy Spirit, the message of St. Luke has reached us today!

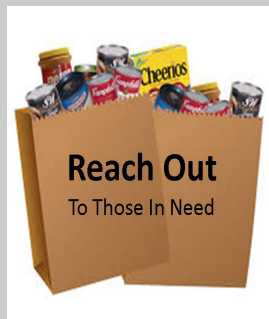

Place all donations in the blue container in the coat closet by the Narthex. (You don't need to give every month. Please give when you can, what you can.) Thank you for all your donations.

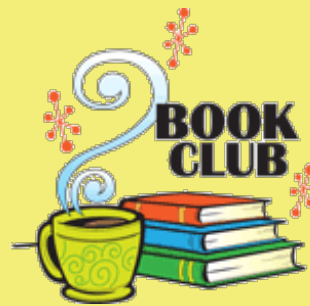
Aurora Interfaith appreciates all past donations but they can only accept food, clothing, toilet paper, toiletries and diapers. All other items should be taken to local thrift stores.
