

"The focus of Lent is not first of all the passion of our Lord, but Baptism," so write Bobb & Boehringer in their worship planning guide (Proclaim, p. 115). "Lent is a time of growing into Christ by concentration on our Baptism, so that the obstacles set in the way of God's grace by our old nature may be removed by His Spirit and we may be signs of God's Kingdom in the world. It calls for a greater openness to the Word of God, zeal in joining the congregation in worship and sharing in the Holy Communion, and conversion in every area of faith and life that we may walk in the Gospel of Christ" (ibid, p 113).





Consequently, a number of congregations along the front range of Colorado are joining together to make University Lutheran Chapel, Boulder, an ongoing mission for their congregation. I would like Mount Olive to be a part of this vital group. The field is truly white for harvest as universities are rich with students from all walks of life who are searching for answers.

Sunday night Mount Olive sponsored an after worship dinner for students at the chapel (thank you Allie Kade!) We met some wonderful people, including a student from Iran who is currently studying the catechism at ULC and may one day, by God's Grace, be baptized into the Kingdom of Heaven. Several recent graduates were present and active in the service as well as a few professors. ULC is a wonderful opportunity for outreach in our own back yard!

How can we help? I'm glad you asked. Right now the chapel is asking for individuals to commit to \$50 a month (over and above your regular tithe to Mount Olive).
