








Salutation and Collect of the Day: Pentecost Day

Old Testament Reading: Numbers 11:24-30

²⁴Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD. And he gathered seventy men of the elders of the people and placed them around the tent. ²⁵Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. And

as soon as the Spirit rested on them, they prophesied. But they did not continue doing it.

²⁶Now two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the Spirit rested on them. Second Reading: Acts 2:1-21

¹When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. ⁴And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

⁵Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. ⁶And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own

17"'And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams;
18 even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy.


- Holy Communion is a confession of faith. If you are not currently a confessing member




The Words of Our Lord


Hymn of the Month

The hymn of the month for May 2023 is Lutheran Service Book (LSB) #502 - Holy Spirit, the Dove Sent from Heaven. In 1972, Philip Blycker (b. 1939) was Professor of Sacred Music at the Central American Theological Seminary (an evangelical seminary) in Guatemala City. Noticing vast differences in theology concerning the doctrine of God the Holy Spirit among the many Protestant churches in the city, Blycker made a study of the Holy Spirit, which resulted in an extensive list of names, attributes, and metaphors that he then condensed into poetic form, resulting in this hymn. The first stanza uses a double image: the first of the Christian as the temple filled with the Holy Spirit; the second is the Old Testament temple and altar filled with incense, showing the presence of God. The second stanza draws a parallel between the filling of the Church with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and the glory of the Lord filling the Old Testament temple with a cloud. The second half of the stanza presents the work of the Holy Spirit in the baptized Christian. Stanza three addresses the Holy Spirit as the "unction of blessing." Unction is often linked to the anointing with oil that may take place at baptisms, but it is also the word for the oil itself. The stanza ultimately turns to Holy Baptism, with the Spirit making the waters of baptism both living and life giving. The final stanza begins with the Holy Spirit's descent at Pentecost and ends with the very work of the Spirit – to point the Christian to Christ.

The tune SANTO ESPÍRITU are the first words of the text in Spanish and was composed by Philip Blycker shortly after writing the text.
