








Salutation and Collect of the Day: Easter 4 (Three-Year Lectionary)

First Reading: Acts 4:1-12

¹As they were speaking to the people, the priests and the captain of the temple and the Sadducees came upon them, ²greatly annoyed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the

dead. ³And they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. ⁴But many of those who had heard the word believed, and the number of the men came to about five thousand.

Holy Gospel: John 10:11-18

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the tenth chapter.



¹¹[Jesus said:] "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹²He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. ¹⁴I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. ¹⁷For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again. ¹⁸No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father."






Welcome Christian friends! Please respect what we believe, teach and confess regarding the Lord's Supper.


- Holy Communion is a confession of faith. If you are not currently a confessing member




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
HYMN OF THE MONTH

The hymn of the month for April 2024 is Lutheran Service Book (LSB) #597 – *Water, Blood, and Spirit Crying*. We will sing this as a congregation on May 5, 2024, as the text is taken directly from the Epistle for that day, 1 John 5:1-8. A LCMS pastor, Stephen P. Starke (born 1955), wrote this hymn text in 1999. Starke began writing hymns at the end of his seminary study at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana, in 1983, and has since written more than 200 hymns, 32 of which are in the LSB. The opening and closing stanzas of the hymn confess the significance of the water, blood, and Spirit of Christ crying out to us; "crying," that is, in the sense of proclaiming rather than sobbing or weeping. The middle three stanzas focus in turn on the testimony of each of these three witnesses. Stanza 2 focuses on how all our sins are buried with Christ in Holy Baptism (Romans 3:3-11). Stanza 3 moves to the Lord's Supper, in which the life-giving body and blood of Christ are delivered to us to eat and drink. Christ "spreads a table where He feeds us with His body and His blood". Stanza 4 spells out the witness of the Spirit, who is active through the Word. God has drawn the two-edged sword of the Spirit (Hebrews 4:12), the Word of God, which destroys death and gives us eternal life.

The tune used for this hymn is FILTER, which is the surname of the grandfather of the composer, Jeffrey Neal Blersch (Born 1967), a professor of music and university organist at Concordia University, Nebraska, in Seward. Blersch has been an active church musician since the age of eight, when he was appointed organist at Peace Lutheran Church, Cincinnati. He is known for his skill of organ improvisation and is a frequent recitalist, hymn festival presenter, and active composer. He has written tunes for 4 hymns in the LSB.
